Violation of Governing Documents: Covenants, Bylaws & Clubhouse Rule Book

Nature Pointe is a community that was developed for the common benefit of its members. Rules and Covenants were established for the safety and enjoyment of all members and guests. A system of consequences and fines have been created for those who violate the rules. In the event that of a violation, the following shall apply; however, if the Board determines the violation/s are egregious or intentional violation/s, the Board may determine that enhanced penalties are appropriate and may be imposed.

1. Determination of Violation:

The Board of Directors will determine if a violation exists.

2. Seeking Cure -1st Notice:

If the alleged action is determined to be a violation of the HOA Governing Documents, the Board will notify the owner in writing and require that the violation be cured within 14 days.

3. Non-Compliance -2nd Notice:

If the violation continues beyond the 14 days cure period, or if other violations occur and/or are repeated within a year, the Board may impose reasonable monetary fines and/or suspend the member's privileges. Failure to pay the fine/s within 60 days will result in suspension of member privileges for 1 year. All fines will also constitute an assessment under the Declaration.

4. Repeated Violations:

Any member who commits more than 3 violations of any provision of the HOA Governing Documents may be subject to additional fines and/or suspension of their member privileges at the discretion of the Board, regardless of whether the violation has been cured after either the 1st or 2nd violation.

5. Failure to Pay:

Failure to pay fines within 90 days will constitute a lien upon the violator's property. The HOA may collect the fine in any manner allowable by the Declaration, by law and/or seek injunctive relief. In addition, the Board may levy specific assessments to cover the cost the HOA incurs to bring the member/property into compliance with HOA requirements under the Governing Documents.
